 adjoining the lands of John Pinner on the West side & on the South side situated
 by the River of James & on all other sides by the lands of John D. Williams &
 containing four hundred & forty six acres more or less, the other tract lies apart in
 the County of Brunswick & the other part on the County of Southampton & lands
 as follows on the North by the lands of another John & on the South & East by the lands
 of Patrick Sharp & by the lands of John Pinner on the East & containing one hundred
 & seventy six acres say more or less, lands & tenements purchased of Robert Landry. To have
 & carry to John D. his heirs or assigns a parcel of lands with the tenements hereunto made
 all and singular above the premises herebefore described is intended to be bargained
