us privately and apart from her husband and having the seal afterwards fully affixed  
to her hat she said Mary Ann Chapman acknowledged to us same to be her true  
and valid and declared that she had willingly signed herself and delivered the same  
and that she wished not to retract it, several under our hands and date this 2d day  
of June 1848.

A.D. Deed of Burgeon and half from Chapman and wife to John H. Smith  
was given by the wife of H. J. Little and Sufey Parker, son of the Wading church as  
to said Peter Chapman one of the parish inhabitants dead on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 1846  
was also given by the wife of John H. Smith the son of the Wading church as to said Peter  
Chapman and together with the confirmation of the parson minister and schenckerguard  
of the wife admitted to Record.

Will Pittley make and entitle into this Instrument of Obedience on the  
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six between Sufey Pittley of the  
County of Southampton of the first part and Elizabeth A. Pittley widow and wife  
of Henry Pittley of the second part Whereas to Marriage a shortly intended to be had  
and consummated and between the said Sufey Pittley and the said Elizabeth Pittley  
and Whereas the said Elizabeth A. Pittley are both proprietors of a considerable net  
and personal estate consisting of lands and slaves and other personal property  
and Whereas it is the wish of both parties that their several estates shall be held  
and disposed to the entire and benefit and enjoyment of each respectively to that  
the wife of the one shall in no wise be subject to the title or tributary of the other  
during the said contract or the first arising from the said estates and whereas  
the said Elizabeth shall after and during the said contract have the first and  
full disposal of her said estate and the profits arising therefrom and whereas  
it has also been agreed that in case the said Elizabeth should after the said  
intended marriage have happen to inherit the said Sufey Pittley that she should  
not have or claim any part of the said personal estate whereof the said Sufey  
Pittley should be seized or possessed or entitled to at any time during the duration  
thereof by virtue of her being administratrix or entitled to administration of  
the goods and chattels rights and credits of the said Sufey Pittley or otherwise  
desire. Whereas also Sufey Pittley shall in pursuance of the said intent before  
written agreeably to the said Sufey Pittley shall consent and agree that the said  
said Elizabeth shall hold forth enjoy and occupy her said estate both  
real and personal and the interest and profits thereof arising in common  
during the said contract as fully and freely and to all intents and purposes  
and in the said intent of the two said and aforesaid and whereas of the  
said Sufey Pittley same fit and proper and in very need is necessary the
