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I James W. Argubast, Commissioner appointed by the County Court of Southampton at the October term 1855 after giving due notice thereof did cause to be put up to the highest bidder at three months credit a certain tract of land in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia belonging to the estate of the late Robert Moore containing by Metes and Bounds more or less to the same more or less and bounded by the Land of Nathaniel Edmund on the North on the East by the Land of William Becher on the South & Northwest by the Land of William Herring and by the Land of James E. Jones on the Northwest. James E. Jones did thereby sell said tract to the said James W. Argubast Commissioner did bargain and sell and do hereby transfer and convey to the said James E. Jones his heirs and assigns the above described Land for the consideration of the said James E. Jones availing himself with good and sufficient security to him as Commissioner payable three months after the 25th day of October 1855 for thirty dollars to him and to hold the same to the said James E. Jones his heirs and assigns James W. Argubast Commissioner do covenant to the said James E. Jones that he as Commissioner and lawfully assigns of said Land have a good right to convey it & that the same is unincumbered & as Commissioner do further covenant and bind myself my heirs and Representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to the said Land and every part thereof to the said James E. Jones against the lawful claims of all persons whatever till Witness my hand and seal this 25th day of October 1856

White the receipt whereof the said Jeremiah Bell and Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge sheweth fully and amply satisfied and paid hath granted bargain sold conveyed conveyed and confirmed and by these presents hath granted bargain sold conveyed conveyed and confirmed unto the said John W. White to have and his heirs forever an entire tract or parcel of Land premises containing is a sufficient about one hundred & twenty five acres be the same situate or lie within being and lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows to wit on the North by the Lands of the heirs of William Bell and the said Jeremiah Bell on the East by the Mill Swamp commonly called Bellers and on the West by the Peterburg road to the said William Bell's heirs Land together with all house buildings yards water and other courses whatever belonging or in any wise appertaining to the said tract of Land to have and to hold the said same unto the said John W. White his wife for themselves their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns doth by these presents covenant and grant to and with
