This INVENTURE made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year 1846 between

William Whitney and Catherine Person of Southampton County of the first part  
and David S. Day of the County of Isle of Wight, of the 2<sup>nd</sup> part; and whereas Catherine  
of the County of Isle of Wight, of the 2<sup>nd</sup> part, of the said state of Virginia, otherwise  
known as & William Whitney and Catherine Person are jointly indebted to the 2<sup>d</sup>

Master Slave in the sum of eight hundred and four dollars and forty one  
cents due by bond bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> day January 1846 & dated 28 March  
1846 A. D. Sent 15<sup>th</sup> October 1846 more fully appears which debt under the legal  
name Plaintiff, claim arising to S. William Whitney and Catherine Person are owing  
and due from the Plaintiff William Whitney that for and in consideration  
of the premises and also for further consideration of one dollar current money of  
Virginia to the S. William Whitney & Catherine Person above named be it known  
that all is confirmed by their friends to give grant, bargain sell and confirm to the  
S. David S. Day his heirs and assigns from all the right title and interest in  
my deceased husband estate late and now personal effects of different kinds and  
all other property as held from me.

Also also my Negro slave named  
Albert with all and singular the appurtenances to the 2<sup>d</sup> interval rights and title  
of the 2<sup>d</sup> Negro slave and other property and all the estate with title and interest  
of the said William Whitney and Catherine Person or and to the 2<sup>d</sup> greatest or  
intended to be fairly granted interval former Negro slave of different kinds  
household and other utensils beds and other chattels set forth hereto and to him  
the 2<sup>d</sup> fairly granted is intended to be fairly granted former with the appurtenances  
fairly granted unto the S. David S. Day his heirs and executors administrators or assigns  
for ever to the only person now and hereafter of have the S. David S. Day his heirs  
and executors and assigns former with the said William Whitney and Catherine Person  
for themselves their heirs and executors fairly granted former and agree to him with the  
S. David S. Day his heirs and executors and assigns former in manner and form following (to  
wch) that the said William Whitney and Catherine Person their heirs executors and  
administrators the aforesaid former right title property Charles Bryan slave &  
with the appurtenances thereto belonging fairly granted unto the said David S. Day  
his heirs and executors administrators and assigns against all persons who were staff and  
will warrant and serve default by them persons upon their Honorableness that the  
S. David S. Day his heirs and executors and assigns shall permit the S. David S. Day his heirs  
and executors and assigns shall permit the S. William Whitney and Catherine Person to remain  
in quiet possession of the said eight interval Negro slave of different kinds house  
beds and other utensils utensils and equipment further to wit that the said David  
S. Day his heirs executors and assigns shall upon receipt of the payment of the aforesaid  
aforesaid interval or part as the whole upon the request of the S. Master Slave  
have and administer to the said David S. Day his heirs at there or near public  
place in the County out of which S. Southampton at time last day and still for  
each the several Negro property intervals and out of the proceeds of such sale  
first pay and satisfy all cost attending the same, then the rest and the interest  
that may have accrued thereto and the balance of any pay are to the S. David
