This Indenture made the 16th day of January A.D. one thousand eight
hundred and forty seven between James Barrett and his wife Matilda Barrett of
Southampton County &c of the one part and Walter Myrick of Newfane County
& Carolina of the other part Wilmot that the said James Barrett and wife
Matilda Barrett for and in consideration of the sum of sixty four dollars to
bind the said James Barrett in band paid the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged both granted bargained and sold and by the person or persons
bargain and sell unto the said Walter Myrick his heirs and assigns all those
messuages to wit his rightfull part of the undivided interest of Matilda Barrett
and in the lower lands of her Mother Mary Barrett Widow of Jacob Barrett
and it being his the said James Barrett undivided interest in the land
which will accrue to the estate of the said Matilda Barrett and in his portion
of the lower lands of said Mary Barrett at her the said Mary Barret also
all profits advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said lower
lands or his rightfull part of the interest or portion of the said Matilda Barrett
and in the lower lands of said Mary Barrett belonging or in any way appur-
tenant and the revision and revision remainder and remainder unto himself and
profits of the said premises and every part and parcel thereof and all the rents
rights debts interests claims or demands whatsoever of them to the said James Barrett
and his wife Matilda Barrett of and to the said premises or his rightfull
part of the land of the estate of said Matilda Barrett and his and promises
and every part and parcel thereof to him and to his heirs and assigns to the only
value rightfull of the undivided tenth or portion of the land of the lower
of said Mary Barrett which will accrue as aforesaid at his death to the
estate of the said Matilda Barrett and all and singular other the
premises about mentioned and every part and parcel thereof with the
appurtenances unto the said Walter Myrick his heirs and assigns to the only
proportion and legacy of the said Walter his heirs and assigns forever and
the said James Barrett and wife Matilda Barrett for themselves and their heirs
the said premises and premises and every part and parcel thereof against them
and their heirs and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever to
the said Walter Myrick his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and
forever defend his said premises, City Wilms whereof the said James Barrett
and his wife Matilda Barrett have bound set their hands and affixed to
