and forty seven between Saml Harris and Mary E his wife of the County of Hampton
of the first part and Sterling Pledge of the second part Witnesseth that for and in
consideration of the sum of sixty six dollars to them in hand paid before the making
and delivery of these presents which is hereby acknowledged by them they the said
Saml Harris and wife have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain
and sell to the said Sterling Pledge a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the
County aforesaid and bounded as follows beginning at a point in said Harris line called
his line S 61 E 42 1/2 pches to a Walnut tree at corner thence S 89 1/2 E 38 1/2 pches to a
corner in said Pledge line thence along his line N 41 W 120 pches to a south line then
N 1/2 W 58 pches to a Spanish Oak then N 63 W 17 pches to a post Oak then
N 74 W 3 pches to a red oak a corner in the lower land of David Inghit (adj)
thence along said line N 44 1/2 E 17 pches to a Maple tree N 18 E 10 pches to a
branch then N 21 E 56 1/2 pches to a ditch then up said ditch to a pine tree N
76 E 17 pches to a white Oak then S 79 E 36 pches to a red oak then S 72 E
