

Will, IN DILESSUS Made and entered into this 15 day of October 1847 between
 Henry Taylor of the first part Bow & Pope of the second part and James Barnes of
 the third part all of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia: Whereas the said
 Henry Taylor is owing indebted to the said James Barnes in the sum of four hundred
 Dollars and 57/100 due by him bearing even date with this instrument and the said
 Henry Taylor being willing and desirous to secure the said James Barnes in the aforesaid
 said debt and interest: Now this instrument witnesseth that for and in considera-
 tion of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar to him the said
 Henry Taylor in hand paid by the said Bow & Pope at and before the making and
 delivery of this present the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Henry
 Taylor hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant
 bargain and sell to the said Bow & Pope his heirs and assigns for ever the following
 property to wit: his the said Henry Taylors present crop corn cotton peas and
 potatoes thirty bushels hops eight bushels carobs two horses also the surplus if any in
 certain tracts made to Henry Marshall for the benefit of Bow & Pope and the future
 increase of the aforesaid hops and corns to have and to hold to his the said Bow &
 Pope proper now and hereafter forever Upon trust herewith left that the said Henry
 Taylor shall remain in quiet possession of all the aforesaid property until the said
 Bow & Pope shall be ordered by one of the aforesaid parties to sell after which the
 said Bow & Pope shall endeavor at two or more public places giving at least ten days
 notice of the time and place of sale and will at public auction sell the aforesaid property
 as much thereof as shall be sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid debt and out of
 the proceeds first pay the expenses thereof then pay the aforesaid debt and out of the
 balance if any pay over to the said Henry Taylor or his legal representatives and the
 said Henry Taylor covenant with the said Bow & Pope that he is proprietor of an
 absolute and simple right in all the property herein named and that he will furnish
 warrant and defend the same against himself and all other persons whatsoever Testimony
 wherein we and each of us have set our hands and sealed the day and

 & Culina & his wife of the one part & Bullock Lawrence of the other part: Witnesseth that
 the said Francis M. Vaughan & Culina & his wife in consideration of two thousand
 dollars of lawful money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Bullock
 Lawrence at or before the making & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged have granted bargained & sold & by these presents doth grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Bullock Lawrence his heirs and assigns & certain
 pieces of land in the County of Southampton containing by estimation several hundred
 acres by the same there is by this tract embraces what is usually called
 Daniels Woods the Quarter of Whiting also one other tract adjoining the said land
 containing by estimation one hundred forty acres in the said town or by
