This Indenture made and entered into this 9th day of December 1847 between John Underhill of the first part, William D. Clarke of the second part and B & C Examiners H. P. Pope Henry Kimball William Faison Martha Barham John S. Barham & others the heirs of Thomas D. Parker and Sampson C. Rivers John Taylor Paul D. Drury and to William Clarke James County all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia and William Faison of Southampton County State of N. Carolina of the third part Whereas the said John Underhill is legally indebted to the aforesaid individuals in the following amounts to wit: To the said B & C H. P. Pope by bond bearing date with the Indenture in the sum of One hundred and seventy seven dollars and 24/100 To the said Henry Kimball by bond in the sum of Fifty dollars to the said Wm Faison by bond in the sum of Fifty two dollars and 24/100 to Martha Barham by bond in the sum of Fifty five dollars to the heirs of Thomas D. Parker and in the sum of twenty dollars to John S. Barham in the sum of fifteen dollars by bond to Sampson C. Rivers by bond in the sum of eighty or ninety dollars to John Taylor by deed in the sum of twenty dollars to Paul D. Drury by deed in the sum of Fifty Dollars and to James County by deed in the sum of twenty dollars the exact amount and date of all the aforesaid bonds and deeds may be seen by reference to them And the said John Underhill being willing and desirous to settle all the aforesaid debts and interests now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William D. Clarke Treasr at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Underhill he hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain and sell to the said William D. Clarke his heirs and assigns forever the following property (to wit) present crop cotton cane fodder peas and shucks two horses thirty head hogs and other future increase thereof and furniture one Barrow One Crock three Walnut tables and two pine tables four chairs One small firwood sitting chair two shot guns two jugs and some short stumps and five red iron four pots three urns three tubs 3 pails four tongs four Sugs eight staves three at the head of cooking and glass ware five empty Stills eight staves with all other articles of house hold and kitchen furniture two burning places two brass plates eight plates two tin Candles two pots three tin pans two tin kettles three cutting axes three wedges with all other farming implements on Suggy and harness and horse cart and wheels and two gunn unpurged Store of Lard at the plantation which the said Underhill now lives the house
