This Indenture made and entered into this six day of January in the year
 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty eight between Mary Barris
 Sister of James and his wife Lydia B. all of the County of Horry and State of
 North Carolina of the first part and Henry Cook of the County of Horry and
 State aforesaid of the second part Witnesseth that the said Mary Barris Sister of
 James Barris and his wife Lydia B. for and in consideration of the sum of ^{one} hundred and twenty five dollars lawful money of Virginia to them the said Mary
 Barris Sister of James Barris and his wife Lydia B. in hand paid by the said Henry
 Cook at or before the executing of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 and hath granted bargained and sold and by this present doth grant bargain sell
 and convey unto the said Henry Cook his heirs executors administrators and assigns
 forever a certain tract or parcel of land containing more or less and lying four
 acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
 and known by the name of the Blunt place marked and bounded as follows to wit
 Beginning at the intersection of the James creek and the Arno branch & come
 in the S.W. corner line there up the run of said branch to a black gum tree as line
 of marked tree N 23 1/2 E 80 poles then N 26 E 107 poles to a pine stump & corner
 for S.W. corner then along S.W. line of marked tree N 27 E 5 poles to a corner
 then N 4 1/2 E 30 poles to a pine then N 45 E 18 poles to a pine then N 47 E 15
 poles to a post oak then N 5 1/2 E 17 poles to a pine stump then N 57 E 7 poles
 to a pine N 52 1/2 E 10 poles to a pine then N 57 1/2 E 12 poles to a sweet gum then
 N 70 E 60 poles to a white oak N 72 E 10 poles to a red oak N 76 E 14 poles
 to a pine then N 72 1/2 E 6 poles to a sweet gum then N 68 1/2 E 16 poles to a black
 gum then N 57 E 8 poles to a black gum then N 57 E 8 poles to a black gum
 N 54 1/2 E 9 poles to a sweet gum then N 25 E 16 poles to a holly & corner for
 S.W. corner and thence Cook's line then along said Cook's line N 15 E 17 poles to a small
 black gum then N 18 E 20 poles to a large white oak a corner then N 22 E 17 poles
 to a white oak then N 23 1/2 E 30 poles to a pine corner then N 86 E 23 poles to a
 sweet gum then N 55 W 6 1/2 poles to a large white oak then N 72 E 9 poles to a
 Spanish oak N 77 W 64 poles to a post oak then N 84 W 57 poles to a pine
 then N 83 W 5 poles to a pine then N 73 1/2 W 7 poles to a pine then N 79 W 10 poles
 to a black oak then N 71 W 24 1/2 poles to a pine then N 34 W 19 poles to a red
 oak then N 57 1/2 W 22 poles to a small pine in the park then N 88 W 10 poles to
 a black gum then N 64 W 12 poles to a pine then N 55 1/2 W 20 poles to a pine
 then the spring a corner then N 27 E 8 poles to a red oak then N 22 E 12 poles to
 a red oak then N 18 E 23 1/2 poles to a small oak a corner for Henry Cook's line
 thence Cook's line then along said line then S 70 1/2 E 147 poles to a red oak then
 S 71 1/2 W 53 poles to a water oak stump & corner then N 22 W 4 poles to a white oak
 sweet gum and small poplar then N 30 W 24 poles to a maple & corner
 standing on the margin of the low grounds of James Creek, then down a small
 stream or water course 58 poles thence west 58 poles to the corner of the creek then
 down the various courses of the run of said creek to the beginning the corners
 and numerous remainder and quarters partly and other parts here and profits
 and every part and parcel of the same to wit the said tract or parcel of land with the
 thereof, SO HAVE AND TO HAVE the said tract or parcel of land with the
 thereunto belonging and all and singular the premises and appurtenances
 therrunto belonging or in any way appertaining unto the said Henry Cook his
 heirs and assigns forever UNLESS the said Mary Barris Sister of James Barris and
 his wife Lydia B. for themselves their heirs the said tract or parcel of land with
