

This Indenture made the fourth day of February in the year 1848 between Joseph Pringle and Robert Pringle of the one party and John Pringle of the other party Witnesses that the said Joseph and Robert Pringle acting as Commissioners under a decree of the County Court of Southampton entered in the cause of Pringle v Pringle in consideration of four hundred and sixty dollars lawful money to them in hand paid by the said John Pringle as and before the sealing and delivery of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said John Pringle his heirs and assigns four several tracts or parcels of land lying in the County of Southampton whereof Mary Pringle lately died seized to wit: One tract commonly called the Appleton containing about one hundred and seventy acres more or less and bounded as described in the deed recited by Henry Cuth and Hannah & his wife conveying the said land to Joseph Pringle recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton in the year 1817 another tract known as the Baker Lane tract containing about twenty six acres more or less bounded on the back by the lands belonging to the heirs of Joshua Capper on the east by the land hereafter described in the Deed of the tract and on the South and west by the aforesaid the place. Another tract called the Bunwell Burn tract containing about sixty five acres more or less bounded as mentioned in a deed conveying said land from Henry Bunwell to Bunwell Bunwell now of record and on other tract known as the Deed tract containing about one hundred and fifty five acres bounded by the lands of Mary Mc Kaskinburg on the North each of the said the place on the South and by the aforesaid Baker Lane tract on the West together with all and singular the appurtenances belonging or appertaining to the said several tracts of land. To have and to hold the aforesaid tracts of land with the tenements hereto annexed and all and singular thereto pertaining heretofore and hereafter and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights incidents and appurtenances unto the said John Pringle his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Pringle his heirs and assigns And Witness of the said Joseph Pringle Robert Pringle have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written

W. Lawrence Esquire John Lawrence and others the right and title to said tract of land including the buildings
