This Indenture made the 28th day of February 1848 between John M. Loring of the one party and John D. Loring of the other party Witnesses that the said John M. Loring in consideration of one thousand dollars lawful money to them well paid by the said John D. Loring at or before the making and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has bargained and sold and by these presents does bargain and sell unto the said John D. Loring his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton on the south side of the apamunock Swamp. Commonly called Spring Hill containing about six hundred and thirty five acres more or less by its known boundaries thereof which are set forth in deed concerning the said Land from Edmund Bull to John A. Turner now of Record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County together with all and singular the appurtenances and all the improvements on every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said land with all and singular the appurtenances unto the said John D. Loring his heirs and assigns forever and the said John M. Loring for himself and his heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said John D. Loring his heirs and assigns free from the claims of him the said John M. Loring and his heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall with and done wrongfully and forever released by their presents Not Withstand whereof the said John M. Loring has hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written
