This INDEMNITY made the 20th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and forty eight between John Pridlow of the County of Southampton and
State of Virginia of the one part and Matthew Williams of the same County and State of
the other part witnesseth that the said John Pridlow in Consideration of the sum of four
hundred and twenty five dollars Cash in hand paid at or before the making and delivery
of this instrument have bargained and sold unto the said Matthew Williams his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situate
lying and in the County aforesaid containing by estimation 358 acres of land more
or less and bounded as follows viz on the North by land belonging to Long - Aspinwall
on the east by Johnson property on the south by William and Billy Taylor and on the
west and west by Farhurt & Taylor tract being those tracts included in or and known
as the old place where George Pridlow lived the Baker Taylor and the Doge tract together
or with all and singular ripples and ripples remainder and remainder ground and
other parts of and parcels thereof and of every part and parcel thereof so held and
to hold the said 358 acres of land with its tenements hereditaments and all and
singular the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and
any part and parcel thereof with way of other rights, members and appurtenances unto
the said Matthew Williams his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Pridlow for
himself and his heirs the said 358 acres of land with all and singular the premises
and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Matthew Williams his heirs and assigns
free from the claims or claims of him the said John Pridlow his heirs and of all and
any person or persons whatsoever shall with and do warranty and forever defend by
