Barrell of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Mary Barrell for and in Consideration of the sum of thirty four dollars and fifty eight cents Current Money of the Commonwealth to her in hand paid by the said Benjamin J. Barrell at or before the making and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged back granted Bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said Benjamin J. Barrell his heirs and assigns forever one certain piece or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Lukes containing by survey six and one fourth acre be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a red oak standing on its own in the line of William Bryants estate also in the line of the down Land of said Mary Barrell which said down Land was the day sold under a decree of the Court and said Benjamin J. Barrell became the purchaser thence said Bryants line of Markers line to the road that runs S 65° E 76 poles thence S 71° E 13 poles to a corner for said Bryants estate in said down line thence along the down line S 54° E 29 poles to a dead end the road thence N 22° E 57 poles to the beginning To have and to hold the above described piece or parcel of Land with its appurtenances thereto belonging to my wife appearing unto him the said Benjamin J.
