THIS INDENTURE made the day of April one thousand eight hundred & forty eight between John Daddell & Margaret his wife of the County of Bedford & State of North Carolina of the one part & Joseph B. Davis of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John Daddell and Margaret his wife for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to and delivered to her in hand paid by the said Joseph B. Davis the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have granted bargain and sold & by these presents do grant bargain and sell & confirm unto the said J. B. Davis his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing two hundred & twenty acres be the same more or less as by reference to the deed of James D. Kephartburg, Esq. of said County of Southampton will appear which lying and being in the County of Southampton State of Virginia and bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a certain line in Major Rich's tract along his line to Rich's Survey on the lower corner Peachtree line thence along the line to Edward Rich's line thence along said line to the full swamp thence up the full swamp to the bridge & thence to the beginning. being that tract of land known and called the Collier plantation & sold as the property of Major John Rich under a decree of the Supr Court of Law & equity for the County of Southampton & bought by the said John Daddell as will appear in the Records of said County. To have & hold the said tract of land together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said J. B. Davis his heirs and assigns forever. And further the said John Daddell & Margaret & his wife do for themselves in the said land of the said J. B. Davis his heirs and assigns forever acquit the lawful claim of any every person whatsoever claiming under them or their heirs or assigns.
