

This Indenture made the first day of January in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred forty eight between Jeremiah Chappell of the one part and George Johnson of the other part Witnesseth that the said Jeremiah Chappell in consideration of three hundred dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth now in hand paid by the said George Johnson at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold unto the said George Johnson his heirs and assigns forever interest in a certain mill and mill seat or black creek swamp My interest being one half of said mill & mill seat together with all the singular tenements Meadows pastures feeding ways waters water courses fishing privileges profits revenues & appurtenances whatsoever the said half mill belonging or appertaining or with the same usual or proper occasion reputed taken or to be taken as part parcel or member thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof the several possessions remainder and remainders yearly and other rents upon and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said half mill and mill seat with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular unto the promise herebefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with his right heirs and appurtenances unto the said George Johnson his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said George Johnson his heirs and assigns forever And the said Jeremiah Chappell his heirs the said mill & mill seat with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said George Johnson his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claim of him the said Jeremiah Chappell or his heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do warrack & forever deposit by this present Indenture whereof the said Jeremiah Chappell has heretofore at his house and elsewhere by oral the day and year first above written

Priddy at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said George Johnson & Elizabeth his wife have given granted bargained sold conveyed and possessed released and confirmed and by their presents do give grant bargain sell their right interest in & confirm to the said Thomas S. Priddy his heirs and assigns forever all my interest in & water half mill and mill seat or black creek swamp it being one half of the said mill with all and singular the appurtenances to the said half mill belong or any
