This Indenture made this 4th day of July 1848 between Peter Hermann and Harriet his wife of the one part Joseph Dreher of the second part and Schindler of the third part Witnesseth that Whereas the said Peter Hermann is justly indebted to the said Schindler in the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars due by bond or Demand the 25th day of December 1848 and the said Peter Hermann being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid bond have agreed to convey the property hereafter mentioned unto the said Joseph Dreher in trust to be sold for that purpose Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of not dollar to the said Schindler in hand paid by the said Joseph Dreher brother at and before the writing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged each giving grantor his given and conveyed unto the said Joseph Dreher and by their presents heirs and great and small heirs unto the said Joseph Dreher brother his heirs and assigns certain tract or parcel of land and premises lying and being in the Parish of St. Landry and containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Srd Greifenburg & Srd Puder and others with all and singular other appurtenances to the said tract of land belonging or in any wise appurtenant unto the said Joseph Dreher his heirs and assigns In Witness whereof that the said Joseph Dreher shall permit the said Peter Hermann and Harriet his wife to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the above tract of land until after he shall make in the payment of above named bond (according to the conditions of same) then upon this further trust that in case as aforesaid shall be made in the payment of the aforesaid bond according to its condition it shall be the duty of the said Joseph Dreher upon being required so to do by either one of the aforesaid parties to sell the tract of land and purchase the aforesaid
