THIS INVENTIVE made this 28th day of July 1848 between Martha Williams and
Sarah A. Draker of the one part and Henry C. Whitehurst of the other part Whitehurst
that the said Martha Williams and Sarah A. Draker for and in Consideration of the
sum of three hundred and thirty two dollars to them in hand paid by the said
Robert C. Whitehurst the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained
and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry C.
Whitehurst his heirs and assigns forever the following tract of Land to wit: That tract containing
by estimation one hundred and fifty acres or there abouts more or less. Also the undivided
interest of which Edmund Hartcomb owned in his tract Richard Hartcombs estate
and also that tract place and lands adjoining supposed to contain twenty acre of
Land on Notchway near the boundaries of which said tract of Land will more fully
appear by reference to a survey from John S. Draker and wife to John R. Williams which
survey is of record in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County on the 21st of April 1845
the right and title which the said Martha Williams and Sarah A. Draker has in
the aforesaid tract of Land and promise was signified to them by the last will
and testament of John R. Williams and so have and to hold the aforesaid tract
of Land and premises together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging
