Daughtery is willing and desirous to secure here this Indenture WITNESSETH that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar to the said Charles B. Daughtery in hand paid by the said Wm M. Sears at and before the executing and delivery of this present indenture whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Charles B. Daughtery that he has granted bargain and sold released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and confirm to the said Wm M. Sears his heirs executors administrators assigns and assigns forever certain negro men by the name of Miles & Jacob To have and to hold the before mentioned negro slaves unto the said Wm M. Sears his heirs executors and assigns forever upon Trust nevertheless that the said Wm M. Sears shall as soon as he can after default of payment of the debt aforesaid with the interest thereon and in addition the time and place of sale of the said negro slaves at the next public place nearest the present residence of the said Charles B. Daughtery present and sell the same to the highest bidder for for the best price that can be obtained in cash and out of the money arising from such sale first pay all the necessary expenses attending the sale and then pay to the said Henry Croft his heirs executors and assigns the debt and interest aforesaid and the balance if any he shall pay to the said Charles B. Daughtery his heirs executors and assigns and the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year as first above written
