of thousand eight hundred and forty eight between Joseph Prindle and Elizabeth
R. his wife of the first part and Thomas R. Prindle and Robert W. Prindle of the second
part all of the County of Surry and State of Virginia Witnesses that the said
Joseph Prindle and Elizabeth R. his wife for and in consideration of the Natural
Love and affection which they bear to the said Thomas R. Prindle and Robert
W. Prindle (their sons) as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to them
in hand paid by the said Thomas R. and Robert W. Prindle at and before the making
and sealing of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given
and granted in consideration of the premises aforesaid and by these presents do give and
grant unto the said Thomas R. Prindle and Robert W. Prindle their heirs and assigns forever
a certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton
Containing Over hundred and seven acres. In the Survey made or help adjoining the
Land of Robert Prindle and bounded on one side by Black Water river together with
all and singular the premises and appurtenances. In said tract of Land belonging or
appertaining or with the same used and enjoyed or accepted regularly to them or to some
or part parcel or remainder thereof or as belonging to the same or any part thereof and
the revenues and revenues annuities and remainders yearly and other rents issues
and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold to
the said tract or parcel of one hundred and seven acres of Land more or less
together with the premises and appurtenances aforesaid unto said Thomas R. Prindle
and Robert W. Prindle their heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use
and behoof forever and the said Joseph Prindle and Elizabeth R. his wife for
themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular
the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Thomas R. Prindle
and Robert W. Prindle their heirs and assigns first from the claims or claims of the said
Joseph Prindle and Elizabeth R. his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs
and of all and every person or persons whomsoever shall will and do Demand and forever
