This said Catharine Deppat do for herself her heirs or assigns warrant and forever defend As Witness our hands & seals this 2nd September 1848

The Conditions of the above obligation is such that whereas James Horner was on the day of October 1848 by the School Commissioners in and for the County of Southampton appointed this Treasurer for the year ending on the 31st day of December 1849 Now if the said James Horner shall faithfully apply and account for all moneys which may come to his hands by virtue of his Office and shall perform all and every act and thing appertaining to his said Office according to Law then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
