Moore hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents does grant bargain and sell unto him the said Harrison D. Moore his heirs and assigns the aforesaid tract of forty six and a half acres more or less with its appurtenances there belonging "To have and to hold the same until him the said Moore his heirs and assigns forever" and the said William S. Schell hereby agrees to warrant and defend the title to the said tract of land & premises unto him the said Moore his heirs and assigns against the claim title or demand of himself the said Schell and those claiming by thought or under him but against the title or demand of no other person or persons whatever. In testimony whereof the said William S. Schell hath hereat set his hand & affixed his seal the day & year first aforesaid.

This Indenture made this 17th day of January in the year 1844 between Josiah Henry of the first part William B. Shands trustee of the second party and John M. Burley constitor of the third part all of the County of Southampton to witness knowm John M. Burley has become bound and has obligated himself to pay to Wm S. Schell debts and execution from the Superior Court of Law and Chancery for upwards of one hundred \$1000 dollars and also to pay to Dr. Thomas P. Butcher a sum for one hundred and fifty dollars & interest to which James Maget is incumbrance debt owing by the said Josiah Henry to the said William S. Schell and Thomas P. Butcher and whereas the said Josiah Henry is willing and desirous to do so himself to the said John M. Burley from all loss or damage which he might sustain by reason of the payment of the aforesaid execution and sum. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the further consideration of one dollar good money of Virginia to the said Josiah Henry we hands paid by the said William B. Shands trustee and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Recipies whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said Josiah Henry has given grantee bargained and sold and by these presents to grant bargain and sell to the said William B. Shands to him and his heirs forever one Negro slave named Pompey and all right title and interest which the said Josiah Henry may have in and to the said slave and to the said Josiah Henry for himself and heirs does hereby covenant with the said William B. Shands his heirs and assigns he the said William B. Shands title to the said slave to warrant and defend forever against all my person whosoever by this present upon trust nevertheless that the said William B. Shands shall permit the said Josiah Henry to remain in quiet until reasonable payment of the said slave until he shall be required to sell by the said John M. Burley there after having given reasonable notice of time and place of sale by advertisement at the Court house door of such time as the said William B. Shands shall please to set at public auction.
