estate which the said James Bryant has heretofore had in and to a certain
lot and parcel of Land lying in the County and parish aforesaid and bounded
to contain forty three and three fourth acres. To the same more or less and bounded
by the Lots of the following named persons to wit: Jacob Dorell the heir or heir
of Lewis Dorell dead and the said Lewis Vick: To have and to hold the said
interest and estate of and in the above described Land and every part and
parcel thereof to him the said Lewis Vick and to his heirs and assigns forever free
from the claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever hereby
warranting & confirming the title hereby conveyed to him the said Lewis Vick his
heirs and assigns forever: So witness whereof the said James Bryant has here

in full and absolute property the Receipt and delivery of all which are hereby acknowledged
and before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents have granted, bargained and
sold and by these presents the aforesaid grant sell alien and convey unto the said Crump
and his heirs and assigns forever two tracts or parcels of Land containing by estimation
