Receipt of which is hereby acknowledged bargained and sold and by these
presente sell and convey to the said Lewis Vick all the right title interest and
estate which he the said James Bryant here before held in and to as certain
lot and parcel of Land lying in the County and parish aforesaid and disposed
to contain fully three and three fourth acres. To the same man or less and bounded
by the Lines of the following named persons to wit; Susan Dorrell the heirs or heir
of Lewis Dorrell dead and the said Lewis Vick. To have and to hold the said
interest and estate of and in the above described Land and every part and
parcel thereof to him the said Lewis Vick and to his heirs and assigns forever
from the claim of him the said James S. Bryant his heirs and assigns and also
from the claim or demand of all and every person or persons whatsoever hereby
warranting & defending the title hereby conveyed to him the said Lewis Vick his

for equal amounts bearing date respectively on the 5th of April 1849, for the further conside-
ration of the transfer and delivery of a Negro Man slave of the value of about \$450,
also of the transfer and delivery of all which are hereby acknowledged
in full and absolute property the Receipts and delivery of all which are hereby acknowledged
and given before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents have granted bargained and
sold and by these presents do bargain grant sell alien and convey unto the said Crump
and his heirs and assigns forever two tracts or parcels of Land containing by estimation
altogether 4 1/4 acres: one tract or parcel containing 40 & 3/4 the other 3 1/4 acres the latter
situating the former on the South and conveyed by Washington Hunt by deed of,
