

This Indenture made and entered into this the 14th day of July 1847 between
Charles R. Dauglery of the County of Southampton of the first part John R. Williams
of the aforesaid County of the second part, and Robert B. Gardner of County of Isle
of Wight of the third part all of the State of Virginia witness the said Charles R.
Dauglery a justly indebted to the sum of £ Dmre 900 in the sum of one hundred
nineteen dollars & seven cents due by him to me late the 20th day of June 1843.
Whereof the said Robert B. Gardner is bound which is at the said £ 900.
Dauglery is willing to remit now & hereafter Williams what for and in
consideration of the premises for the further sum of one dollar to said Charles R. Dauglery
in hand paid by the said John R. Williams at and before the sealing and delivering
of these presents the debt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Charles R.
Dauglery both given granted bargained sold and confirmed and by these presents
shall give great bargain sell and confirm unto the said John R. Williams his heirs
and assigns forever all and singularly the following property to wit: one Bay Mare
and bay foal two cows and yearling and calf four hens and twenty two sheep two
pots and furnished and refue and sick board and Banister and Bargates and table chairs
one lumber six dishes 12 plates 12 cups & saucers 12 knives for his meat 12 do
steaks and baking dish four Dishes three pots two pans two spiders and one eight bush
three pairs six traps and set such our cart and wheels and our cart gear one
big'd harness four ploughs two sets ploughs two end shot gun one apple tree full four axis
two bracing bow four wooden bows together with the present growing crop of all kinds
to have and to hold to the said John R. Williams his heirs & assigns forever and to have
that the said John R. Williams his heirs & assigns forever and to have the said Charles R. Dauglery
inasmuch his heirs and assigns hereby covenants and agrees with the said John R.
Williams his heirs & assigns our said as follows: That the said Charles R. Dauglery
deals for himself his heirs and assigns warrant and defend the just right and title of
aforesaid property to the said John R. Williams his heirs & assigns forever and to have
that the said John R. Williams his heirs & assigns promises the said Charles R. Dauglery
to remain in quiet possession of the aforesaid property until default be made in
the payment of the said debt either in part or in the whole then upon either
first, that same as default be made of the payment of the said debt either in part
or in the whole I think the said John R. Williams his heirs & assigns at the request of
him the said R. Gardner his heirs represent the said property to public sale after
giving ten days notice and out of the proceeds arising from such sale pay the
aforesaid debt interest and cost, and the surplus money if any pay to him the
said Charles R. Dauglery to him his heirs or assigns but if the whole of the aforesaid
debt and cost be paid or discharged to the satisfaction of him the said Robert
B. Gardner his heirs or assigns and before the first day of December next shall the
Indenture be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. And witness whereof
