This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of August A.D. 1849 between Nathan Whitley of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the first part: being to Deeds of the second part & Abram Redlick of the third part both of Bedford County North Carolina: Whereas the said Nathan Whitley is justly indebted to Abram Redlick in the sum of four hundred Ninety Dollars & 50^{cs} due by bond bearing date the 1st 1849. with interest from date and also in three other bonds due and payable to James A. Worrell of one hundred Dollars each due and payable as follows: first Jan^y 1st 1850. second Jan^y 1st 1851. third Jan^y 1st 1852. all with interest from Jan^y 1st 1849. The above last bonds are signed by N. Whitley & Abram Redlick security: all the above named debts the said Whitley is willing and desirous to be paid to the said Redlick & James A. Worrell and is willing to secure them hereunto by deed of Mortgage by reason of their several single ships: Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises, and the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by George W. Deeks tendered to the said Nathan Whitley both given granted bargain and sold unto him the said George W. Deeks the following property (to wit) three Negroes. Some, Maria & Pleasant and their increase four hogs one hundred head of hogs twelve head cattle ten head of sheep two hundred barrels of corn Ten thousand pounds black feathers One hundred bushels potatoes five thousand pounds seed cotton ten thousand bushels potatoes four hundred head stock & furniture & cattle wheel & all my farming utensils: all my working tools of every description all my household & kitchen furniture cooking utensils &c. to him and his heirs forever: Upon trust nevertheless that the said Nathan Whitley is to remain in quiet possession of all the aforesaid property until required by the said Abram Redlick and James A. Worrell to be sold: Whereupon the said George W. Deeks tendered shall after advertising for ten days at least in three
