This instrument made and entered into this 6<sup>th</sup> day of November in the  
year 1849 between John W. Rochester of the first part & Wm. B. Hanks trustee  
of the second part, and William D. Clarke Civilitor of the first part,  
all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Whereas the said  
John W. Rochester is justly indebted to the said William D. Clarke, in  
the sum of three hundred and eighty seven dollars and six cents by bond  
bearing the date with this instrument which debt together with the interest  
thereon occurring to the said John W. Rochester is willing and desires to pay over  
to the said Wm. B. Clarke: Now therefore this instrument  
witnesses that the said John W. Rochester for and in consideration of the  
sums and for the further consideration of five dollars to the said John  
W. Rochester in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these  
presents by the said William B. Hanks the receipt whereof is hereby  
acknowledged, hath given granted, bargained and sold and by these presents  
does give grant bargain and sell unto the said William B. Hanks at  
full and equal thirty six value of a certain tract or parcel of Land lying  
partly in the Counties of Southampton and Princess Edward to contain  
fifteen hundred acres to the same more or less formerly owned by Sam<sup>r</sup>  
Hanks together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto in  
any manner appertaining: To have and to hold the said full and equal  
thirty six value of the said tract or parcel of Land together with all the  
appurtenances thereto in manner appertaining unto him the said William  
B. Hanks and his heirs and the said John W. Rochester for himself  
and his heirs does hereby covenant and agree with the said William  
B. Hanks his wife unto the said full and equal thirty six value in  
the said tract or parcel of Land forever to warrant and defend against  
any person whatsoever upon trust nevertheless that the said John  
W. Rochester shall be permitted to remain in quiet and peaceable pos-  
session of the said Land and receive the profits thereof until default  
shall be made in the payment of the said bond due to the said William
