

ASIDE IN DULINCEMENT made and entered into this 20<sup>th</sup> day of November in  
the year 1849, by and between Robert Ridley, and Wm. S. Gardner, Esq., Comr<sup>s</sup> of  
the first part, and Francis J. Ridley of the second part, all of the  
County of Southampton: Whereas the said Ridley & Gardner of the first  
part were appointed by the County Court of Southampton County, the 2<sup>d</sup> day  
of June term 1849, Commissioners to sell at Publick Trust of Land, known  
commonly known as the "James Street" land belonging to the heirs  
of Howell Jones containing 146 acres more or less and bounded by the  
lands of the late Dr. Abbott Gardner the said G. J. Ridley and the  
tract known as "Pang Gwyn" belonging to the Estate of Edward J.  
Simmons deceased, and the said Francis J. Ridley became the purchaser  
at the sum of £ 120.00 and whereas the County Court of the County  
aforesaid by decree at that term 1849, directed the said Comr<sup>s</sup> parties  
of the first part to execute a deed for the aforesaid tract of Land  
to the said G. J. Ridley with special warranty: Now that it doth appear  
whereby that for and in consideration of the premises and in order  
that the heirs of the last mentioned deced. the said parties of the first  
part Comr<sup>s</sup> &c have given granted bargained and sold and do by these  
privileges give grant bargain and sell unto the said Francis J. Ridley the  
aforesaid tract of Land with all appurtenances thereto belonging  
to him the said Ridley and his heirs forever: And the said parties of  
the first part for themselves and their heirs covenants to and with the  
said Francis J. Ridley and his heirs to warrant and defend the title  
to the aforesaid tract of Land against all lawful claims forever by  
or through whom the said parties of the first part: Now whereof witness  
of the said parties of the first part have hereunto set their hands  
and seal this day and year first before written

THIS IN DULINCEMENT made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1849 between Wm. S.  
Debelle of the first part and Wm. H. Nicholson of the second part, witnesseth  
that the said Wm. Debelle for and in consideration of the sum of seven dollars  
to him in hand paid by the said Wm. H. Nicholson the receipt of which is hereby  
acknowledged back bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and  
sell to the said Wm. H. Nicholson as certain parcel of land lying in the County  
of Southampton being a portion of the land formerly belonging to Joseph  
Drewry and joining the land of Wm. H. Nicholson containing four & one-half acres  
and laid off as follows: Beginning in the old Road at the point where the  
old line crosses the Road & running North 53<sup>1/2</sup> E. 66<sup>1/2</sup> pole to the new Road  
& thence down the said Road to old line. To have and to hold the  
said parcel of Land with its privileges and appurtenances unto the said  
Wm. H. Nicholson his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim or
