 one thousand eight hundred and forty nine between Carr Corbit of Southamp-
 ton County of the one part and Carr Bourne of the same County of the
 other part: Witnesseth that the said Carr Corbit for and in consideration
 of three hundred dollars cash in hand paid the Receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by their persons do
 bargain and sell unto the said Carr Bourne his heirs and assigns a certain
 Tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing
 by estimation one hundred and three and a half acres the same more or
 less and bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at the mouth of the Cypress
 Swamp where it enters into the Blackwater River thence up the said river
 to the mouth of Jacks branch thence along the said Jacks branch to
 Harrison's Survey line of Marshes thence said line to Taylors quarter
 said but to Blackwater River thence up said River to the mouth of said
 Swamp the first named station it being the Tract of Land heretofore
 from his Father John Corbit together with all and every part and
 parcel thereof: To have and to hold the said one hundred and three
