This Indenture made and entered into the eighteenth day of February eighteenth hundred and fifty between Augustus Taylor Commissioner as herein after mentioned of the first part, and Manning & Smith of the second part: Witnesseth that whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for the County of Southampton pronounced on the 10th day of November 1848 in a certain suit then there pending between Manning & Smith in his own right and as administrator of Lewis W. Bishop deceased plaintiff and John A. Hurley Executor of William A. Spauld who was Executor of Clement Rochelle died and others Defendants, it was adjudged ordered and decreed that Richard A. Grump, who was then appointed a Commissioner for that purpose should sell at public auction certain Lands therein mentioned of which Clement Rochelle died seized after giving Notice therein required of the time and place of sale: And whereas the said Richard A. Grump in pursuance of the said Decree did report to said the Lands of the said Clement Rochelle therein authorized to be sold on the 17th day of February 1849 at which sale the said Manning & Smith became the purchasers of the tract of Land hereinafter more particularly described, and paid in Cash to the said Commissioner the sum of forty Dollars, and received his land payable to the said Richard A. Grump as Commissioner within months after sale for the sum of four hundred and sixty nine Dollars and twenty five cents, being the residue of the purchase money of the said tract of Land with Wells D. Sumner and Richd W. Bishop as tenants which said land was returned by the said Commissioner to the said Court with his Report of sale, and whereas by another Decree pronounced in the said Cause by the said Court on the 8th day of November 1849 the said so made by the said Commissioner, and it was then and there decreed that Augustus Taylor the Attorney for the specially constituted of Clement Rochelle died who had proved his claim before the Commissioner in said Cause should receive from the Clerk of the Court the said lands with the other lands returned by the said
