Prince Execs as aforesaid have granted, sold and conveyed unto the said Walter all that tract or parcel of land whereof the said Henry Williamson died possessed containing thirty three acres by the same known as a lot, and bounded by the Lands of Stephen Adams, known as the Rivers tract of Land, and by the Lands belonging to the Orphans of John Thomas died To have and to hold the said granted premises with the appurtenances to him the said William H. Walter and his heirs forever, and the said O. B. Cloud and Joseph H. Prince Executors as aforesaid covenanted with the said William H. Walter that he shall have quiet possession and a good title to the said granted premises free from the claims of the said Cloud and Prince Executors as aforesaid and all other persons claiming by or through them as Executors as aforesaid; or by or through them as Executors as aforesaid; or by or through their said Executor. This Indenture made and entered into this twentieth day of March eighteen hundred & fifty between Izrael Taylor Commissioner as herein after mentioned of the first part, and William Jaynes of the County of Southampton of the second part; Witnesseth that Whereas by a Decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Land & Chancery for the County of Southampton pronounced on the 10th day of November 1848 in a certain suit herein pending between Benjamin A. Smith in his own right and as administrator of Susan D. Bishop dec'd plaintiff and John A. Turley Executor of William H. Prince dec'd who was Executor of Clement Rochelle dec'd and others Defendants, it was adjudged ordered and decreed that Rich^d A. Crump, who was then by appointment a Commissioner for that purpose should sell at public auction certain Lands herein mentioned of which Clement Rochelle dec'd & J. A. Crump after giving Notice herein required of the time & place of sale, and whereas the said Rich^d A. Crump in pursuance of said Decree did repeat to sell the Lands of the said Clement Rochelle and he did so on the 17th day of July 1849, at which sale the said William Jaynes became the purchaser of the tract of Land herein after particularly mentioned and paid to the said Rich^d A. Crump as Commissioner the sum of fifty six Dollars & ten cents and executed his bond payable to said Crump as Commissioner in twelve months after date for the sum of two hundred & eighty six Dollars
