This indenture, made and entered into, on this 13 day of April in the year of our Lord, Eighteen hundred and fifty, between Joseph St. Barham and Sarah J. his wife, of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia, of the one part, and Benjamin O. Myrick of the same County and State, of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Joseph St. Barham and Sarah J. his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of current money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Benjamin O. Myrick, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto him the said Benjamin O. Myrick, his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton, and parish of Saint Luke's, containing one hundred and five and half Acres (or the same more or less) it being part of the Tract of land, that the said Joseph St. Barham purchased of the heirs of Edwin Reese dec'd, and bounded by the lands of Drury Waller, Vance Miller and Spratty Williams; and by a new line made between said Barham and Myrick, beginning at a small post oak standing on the road in said Drury Waller's line, running N. 32 1/2 W. 17 1/2 Poles to a small Post oak in said Spratty Williams' line - To have and to hold the above described Tract or parcel of land and premises, with its appurtenances, unto him the said Benjamin O. Myrick his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin O. Myrick, his heirs and assigns forever - And the said Joseph St. Barham and
