Barkham for This Indenture, made and entered into, On this 13 day of April in the year
to / Deed our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty, between Joseph St. Barkham and Sarah¹
Myrick his wife, of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia, of the one
part, and Benjamin C. Myrick of the same County and State of the other
part. Witneseth that the said Joseph St. Barkham and Sarah¹ his
wife, for and in consideration of the sum of

current money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to
them in hand paid by the said Benjamin C. Myrick, at or before
the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged. Have granted, bargained and sold, and
by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto him the said
Benjamin C. Myrick, his Heirs and assigns forever one certain tract
or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County
of Southampton, and parish of Saint Lukis, containing One hundred
and five and half Acres (be the same more or less) it being part of
the Tract of land, that the said Joseph St. Barkham, purchased
of the Heirs of Edwin Reece dec^d, and bounded by the lands of
Drewry Waller, Nancy Miller and Spratty Williams, and by a
new line made between said Barkham and Myrick, beginning at
a small post Oak standing on the road in said Drewry Waller's
line, running N. 32° 43' W. 173 Poles to a small Post oak in said
Spratty Williams line. To have and to hold the above de-
scribed Tract or parcel of land and premises, with its appurtenances
thereunto belonging or any wise appertaining, unto him the said Benja-
min C. Myrick his Heirs and assigns forever, to answer the only
proper use and behoof of him the said Benjamin C. Myrick, his
Heirs and assigns forever. And the said Joseph St. Barkham
