 James Scott dec'd and bounded by a new line from a Maple standing
 on Powell's Road to a pine a new corner on James Council's line, thence
 along Council's line to Harrison Beal's line; thence along Beal's and brother
 William's lines to the beginning. To have and to hold the said tract
 of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the premises herein
 before mentioned or intituled to be bargained and sold and every part and
 parcel thereof unto the said Eliza Eliza Jones, his brothers and sisters
 as aforesaid and their heirs forever. And said Mary St. Mabunting
