This Indenture made and entered into this 6th day of July in the year 1850, between Vincent
 & M. L. Horn of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part Benjamin C. Everett of
 the 2nd part and William M. Everett and M. L. Horn of the 3rd part. Whereas the said
 Vincent Horn is justly indebted to the said William M. Everett in the sum of Fifty
 seven Dollars and eighty five cents, by note bearing date 28th day of June 1850
 he is also indebted to the said M. L. Horn in the sum of Fifty Dollars by note
 bearing date the 29th day of June 1850 and is willing and desirous to secure the
 said Will. M. Everett his debt and Interest first and render him secure in the premises
 and is then willing and desirous to secure to the said M. L. Horn her debt and Interest
 of the amt. above specified. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in
 consideration of the premises in the further sum of one dollar to him paid
 by Benjamin C. Everett at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents.
 The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, by the said Vincent Horn
 Hatt given, granted, bargained and sold unto these presents doth grant bargain
 sell and confirm unto the said Benjamin C. Everett and his assigns forever, the follow-
 ing property (Sovr't) his entire growing Crop of all kinds cultivated this year on the
 premises of William M. Everett, consisting of corn, cotton, Beans, Peas, Cotton and
 oats &c: upon Trust nevertheless that if the said Vincent Horn shall well and truly
 pay unto the said Everett his debt and Interest as above stated, also pay unto
 the said Mary L. Horn her debt and Interest, then these presents to be null
 and void, else it shall be lawfull for the said Benjamin C. Everett after giving
 the said Vincent Horn ten days notice of the time and place of sale, and of the pro-
 cess thereof first to pay and satisfy the said Everett his debt of fifty seven Dollars
 and eighty five cents with interest thereon from 28th day of June 1850, till paid
 and then pay and satisfy the said M. L. Horn her debt and Interest together with
 the expenses hereof, and surplus if any pay unto the said Horn, or his assigns
 given under our hands and seals, this day and year first above written.
