of the time and place of sale, sell at public auction for Bark all
the property hereby conveyed or so much thereof as shall be suffici-
ent to satisfy said debts and interest and out of the proceeds
first pay the expenses thereof, then pay the debt of one
hundred and eighteen dollars and 89/100, with interest, due B. E. &
H. P. Pope. Second pay the debt due B. E. & G. C. Pope
of fifty eight dollars and fifty cents with interest thereon, after
which pay all the other claims and interest, herein set forth or named
in this indenture, and the balance if any pay over to the said
Lawrence Pope or his legal representative. And the said Lawrence Pope
covenant with the said John Barkham that he is possessed of
an absolute fee simple right in all the property heretofore named
and that he will furnish warrant and defend the same against
