 of fifty eight dollars and fifty cents with interest thereon, after
 which pay all the other claims and interest, hereinset forth or named
 in this indenture, and the balance if any pay over to the said

 covenant with the said John Barham that he is possessed of
 an absolute fee simple right in all the property herebefore named
