Newson and his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven hundred and forty dollars by the said Bacham to the said Newson and his wife in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. They, the said Newson and his wife do, by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said Samuel H. Bacham and his heirs for ever, all that tract or parcel of land in the County of Southampton bounded as follows: Beginning at a dogwood tree in Frank B. Clark's line on Elizabeth Little's line, thence down Elizabeth Little's to the run of three creeks, thence down the three creeks to a corner in William Watson's line at the said creek, thence up said Westwork's line to a corner in the oak, thence to the Rankin Swamp, thence through said swamp to the main run, thence up the run to the lands formerly being to Bacham's farm, but now belonging to the heirs of Doctor John
