Chamos his heirs, Executors, and administrators and assigns forever - Upon Trust nevertheless that the said William B. Chamos shall permit the said Josiah Cygner to remain in peaceable and quiet possession of the said crops & other property hereby conveyed until default be made in the payment of said sum of money - So soon after the happening of such default of payment at the request of the said Jno. M. Gurley, sell at public auction, the property hereby conveyed after giving at least Ten days notice of the time and place of such sale: and the monies arising from the proceeds of such sale, after paying all legal expense, pay and satisfy the debt & interest, which may accrue on said bond, and after fully satisfying all claims which are now due the said Gurley upon the debts referred to, pay the balance to the said Josiah Cygner if any remain. Know all men by these presents, That the said Josiah Cygner of the County of Southampton, do hereby certify that the said Josiah Cygner and his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven hundred and forty dollars by the said Chamos to the said Newson and his wife in hand paid, at and before the signing and delivery of these presents, The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they, the said Newson and his wife do, by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said Samuel A. Barham and his heirs, all that tract and parcel of lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows: Beginning at a dogwood tree in Joseph S. Carter's line and Elizabeth Little's line, Thence down Elizabeth Little's line to the sum of three acres, Thence down the three creeks to a corner in William Westbrook's line at the said creek, Thence up said Westbrook's line to a corner between Oak, Thence to the Barham Swamp, Thence through said Swamp to the main run, Thence up the run to the lands formerly belonging to Barham Swamp, but now belonging to the heirs of Doctor John
