This Indenture, made and entered into this 19th day of July 1850, between John M. Beal of the one part, John W. Harrison of the second part and Edward Beaton of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said John M. Beal, Beal Thomas justly indebted with the said Edward Beaton in the sum of sixty four dollars and forty four cents due by bond or note with the 19th day of July 1850, and one other note due to the said Edward Beaton in the sum of one hundred dollars - due by note or bond in this Book Page four dated the 18th day of July 1850, and due the Twenty first day of December 1850, and being and desiring to secure the payment thereof, both for and in consideration of the premises as well as for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said John W. Harrison, Bargained and sold, aliened, impleaded and assigned, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, release and confirm unto the said John W. Harrison his heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns the following property, to wit: one team mare, four head of cattle, twenty six head of Hogs fifteen head of sheep, one cart & wheels, one team plough & gear, two gubson ploughs, cart gear, one gubson hoe, six breeding hoes, three iron wedges, one pitch fork, one saw, three axes, one hatchet, three augers one foot aug, three plough hoes, two corsets two chisels, two Hogs one lot of hogheads & Bells, two feather Beds & furniture, two pine chests, two pine tables, one shop table, three pots & hooks, one corn, one spider, one pan, two shillings, one Loom & beam, two jugs, one Dymplets, three dishes, half dozen Table spoons, one set knives & forks, three Butcher knives, one lot Bacon, one lot corn, one lot fodder, cups & saucers, one dozen sitting chairs, one pair stihlards, one lot Baskets, some tins, one striped Quilt measure, one stone pitcher, one stone pan, one lot Books, three sad irons, one Tailors horse shears & Gupshaw, two spinning wheels & cards, one Looking glass, one lot of wool, one lot of pickled cotton, one lot of Leather, and all of my present crop now growing: corn, Potatoes, peas, cotton, Potatoes, and Beans, and shot gun. Harrison, or in case of his death for his legal, personal representatives, who is hereby authorized to act, upon being thereto required by the said Edward Beaton his Executors, Administrators or assigns, to make sale of the property aforesaid for cash having given at least Ten days previous public notice of the time and place and out of the money arising therefrom, first pay and satisfy the debts and
