This Indenture, made this 29th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty. Between Henning T. Smith and Martha G. Smith, his wife, of Southampton County, State of Virginia of the one part and Jeremiah Wolfert of the County of T. Smith and Martha, his wife, for and in consideration of them of some hundred dollars to them in hand paid or deemed to be paid by the said Jeremiah Wolfert the receipt whereof the said Henning T. Smith and Martha his wife doth hereby acknowledge and themselves therewith fully satisfied, contented and paid, hath bargain ed, sold and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said Jeremiah Wolfert his heirs and assigns forever a certain piece or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton, and bounded as follows Beginning at a log-jack on the Black Water River, at the said Smiths Wood Landing near the road leading from George Parkers farm to the South Lury road, thence along said road leading from George Parkers road to the South Lury road, thence along said South Lury road towards Smith Leno to a small white oak & Juniper near the Spring called Brothas, thence along a line of marked trees near the margin of the Juniper Marsh to the run of the river branch to a Black Gum in Littleton Moores line, thence along said Moores line to Fiddicks Broths line, thence along Broths line to Black Water River, thence down Black Water River to the first Station, containing four hundred acres more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining unto the said Jeremiah Wolfert his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Henning T. Smith and his wife Martha doth by these presents forever hereafter warrant and defend the right and title of the said land to be good unto him the said Jeremiah Wolfert his heirs and assigns forever clear from and against the lawful right or claim of themselves or any of their heirs and also clear from any against the lawful claim or right of all or any persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the said Henning T. Smith and his wife Martha hath hereunto set their hands and seals the day and date above written.
