This Indenture, made and entered into this 2nd day of February in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty, between Mills Pope and Margaret his wife Isaac H. Davis and Susilla D. his wife, Olivia Reese, Julia A. Joyner, Lewis Felu and Rebecca his wife and Mary Reese of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia and Edwin Reese of the State of all of the one part, and Joseph St. Barham of the said County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the other part; Witnesseth that the said Mills Pope, and Margaret his wife, Isaac H. Davis and Susilla D. his wife, Olivia Reese, Julia A. Joyner, Lewis Felu and Rebecca his wife, Mary Reese and Edwin Reese for and in consideration of them of Six hundred and ninety three dollars, current money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Joseph St. Barham at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth grant, bargain and sell unto him the said Joseph St. Barham, his heirs and assigns forever one certain undivided tract or parcel of Land and premises situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and parish of Saint Luke's containing by a late survey, Three hundred and forty six and a half acres be the same more or less, it being the tract of Land of which Edwin Reese died possessed and bounded as follows, To wit: Beginning at a dead hickory standing near the road in Drury Wallis line, thence along his line of marked trees S. 78° E. 13 to poles to a white oak, thence N. 46½° E. 21 poles to a pine, thence N. 45½° E. 157 poles to a hickory, thence N. 37° E. poles to a pine, large, a corner, thence N. 34½° W. 54 poles to a red oak standing near a small branch, thence down the run of said branch to a sweet gum, a corner of said Wallis and said Joseph St. Barham thence said Barham's line down the run of said branch to the mouth of another small branch thence up the run thereof to a post oak standing on the west side of the road a corner of Spratley Williams, thence along said Williams line S. 72° W. 1½ poles to a pine, thence S. 40° W. 11½ poles to a red oak, thence S. 44½° W. 140 poles to a black gum, thence S. 49° W. 11 poles to a black gum standing in Swamp a corner for said Williams and Nancy Miller, thence along said Nancy Miller's line up the run of said Swamp to a small branch a corner for said Drury Wallis, thence his line up the run of said branch to a dead pine thence S. 45½° E. 22 poles to a post oak stump, thence N. 45° E. 33 poles to a pine, thence N. 42° E. 11 poles to a black oak at the road thence along the road 47½ poles to the beginning: To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of Land and premises, with its appurtenances thence belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Joseph St. Barham, his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Joseph St. Barham his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Mills Pope and Margaret his wife, Isaac H. Davis and Susilla D. his wife, Olivia Reese, Julia A. Joyner, Lewis Felu and Rebecca his wife, Mary Reese and Edwin Reese for themselves, their heirs, Executors and administrators do hereby covenant and agree to and with the
