One bar & others, also one negro boy named George - it being the same tract of land and negro slave which were conveyed by deed of trust from Bray Summers to Edward W. Maysenbury for the benefit of John D. Hart, dated 30th day of April 1849 and admitted to record in the Clerk's office of Southampton County, the 4th day of May 1850. To have and to hold the said tract of land & premises and the aforesaid slave unto him the said Bray Summers his heirs & assigns. And the said Edward W. Maysenbury hereby agrees to warrant the title to the aforesaid land & slave unto the said Bray Summers against the claim of himself, the said Maysenbury & those claiming by, thro or under him but against the claim of any other person whatever - In witness whereof the said Edward W. Maysenbury & John D. Hart, hereunto set their names and affixed their seals this day and year first above written.

This deed made the 24th day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, between Washington L. Reddick and Fanny M. his wife of the one part, and Merit J. Davis of the other part, witnesseth: that in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty Dollars current money of Virginia, the said Washington L. Reddick and Fanny M. his wife, do grant, unto the said Merit J. Davis, all the right, title, interest, power or rights which the said Fanny M. now has or may hereafter have in and to a certain tract, piece or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, containing three hundred acres more or less and is bounded by the lands of Theodore Warren, Wth Batters estate, the Jenningsville road and the lands of Leonard Cobb. And the said grantors release to the said grantee all their claims upon the said lands and covenant that they have the right to convey the same to the grantee, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the same, that they have done or do to incumber the same, that they execute such further assurances of the said lands as may be requisite and that they will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed.
