Whitely to T. D. Pope's trustee

This Indenture, made this 14th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty, between Wmiah Chitty of the first part, John Pope trustee of the second part, and Elisha Pope of the third part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Whereas the said Wmiah Chitty is justly indebted to the said Elisha Pope (by note due January 10th 1849, in the sum of Fifty seven dollars, which debt with the legal interest thereon accruing, the said Wmiah Chitty is willing and desirous to secure; Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to money of Virginia to the said Wmiah Chitty in hand paid by the said John Pope trustee, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Wmiah Chitty hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said John Pope his heirs and assigns forever, the following property, to wit: his present crop of corn, fodder, peas, cotton, potatoes, ground peas, and twenty three head of hogs and their increase. To have and to hold the said property as above mentioned unto him the said John Pope his heirs and assigns forever, And the said Wmiah Chitty for himself, his heirs Executors and assigns doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said John Pope his heirs, Executors, assigns, and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend the title of the aforesaid property hereby conveyed or intended to be hereby conveyed unto the said John Pope his heirs and assigns forever against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever, upon special trust nevertheless, to and for the use, intents and purposes following, that is to say that he the said John Pope shall permit the said Wmiah Chitty to remain in quiet and peaceful possession of the aforesaid property until he shall be requested in writing by either the said Elisha Pope or Wmiah Chitty to sell the said property and satisfy the debt aforesaid and interest thereon accruing or as much of said debt and interest as may then be owing: Then it may and shall be lawful for the said John Pope trustee, or his legal representatives and
