Know all men by these presents, that I James Jackson of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, for and in consideration of the natural love and affection, which I bear to James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by each the said James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner at or before the making and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner their Executors, administrators and assigns, the entire tract or parcel of Land on which the said James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner now live, being and lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton and known as the West Farms, and adjoining the lands of John L. Branch, Sampson C. Reese and others, containing fourteen hundred and eighty five acres be the same more or less, together with all its appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, also the Stock of Horses, Mules, Cattle, Sheep, and Hogs, farming implements of every kind, household and kitchen furniture, present crop of every kind on said Plantation to be equally divided by and between themselves, I do also give to the said James R. Soyner his Executors, administrators and assigns the following negro slaves (To wit) Ben, Henry, John, Jackson, Indiana, Martha, and Amy, and I do also give to the said William T. Soyner his Executors, administrators and assigns the following negro slaves (To wit) Phill, George, Edmund, Richard and Mary, all of the above named slaves being on said farm. I do have and to hold the above described property unto them the said James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner their Executors, administrators and assigns forever, and the said James Jackson for himself his Executors and administrators the said property, as above described unto them the said James R. Soyner and William T. Soyner their Executors, administrators and assigns against the claim of him the said James Jackson his Executors and administrators and against the claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend them by these presents.
