Soymer

Know all men by these presents, that I James Jackson of the County of Southampton and
State of Virginia, for and in consideration of the natural love and affection, which I
bear to James R. Soymer and William A. Soymer, both of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar
to me in hand paid by each the said James R. Soymer and William A. Soymer at or
before the issuing and delivery of these presents, The Receipt whereof is hereby ac-
knowledged, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto
the said James R. Soymer and William A. Soymer their Executors, administrators
and assigns, the entire Plantation or farm of Land on which the said James R.
Soymer and William A. Soymer now live, being and lying in the aforesaid County
of Southampton now known as the West Plains, and containing the lands of
John T. Branch, Sampson C. Rees and others, containing Fifteen hundred
and eighty five acres to the same more or less, together with all its
appurtenances thereto belonging, & in any wise appertaining, also the Stock of
Horses, Mules, Cattle, Sheep, mottogs, farming implements of every kind
household and kitchen furniture, present crop of every kind on said Plantation
to be equally divided by me between themselves, I do also give to the said
James R. Soymer his Executors, administrators and assigns the following
Negro slaves (Court) Ben, Henry, John, Jackson, Malvina, Martha, and
Amy and I do also give to the said William A. Soymer his executors, ad-
ministrators and assigns the following negro slaves (Court) Phill, George
Edmund, Richard and Mary all of the above named slaves being on
said farm, to have and to hold the above mentioned property unto them
the said James R. Soymer and William A. Soymer their executors, administrators
and assigns forever, and the said James Jackson for himself his executors
and administrators the said property as above described unto them the said
James R. Soymer and William A. Soymer their executors, administrators
and assigns against the claim of him the said James Jackson his Execu-
tors and administrators and against the claims of all and every person or persons
whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend them by these presents
