Know all men by these presents, that I, James Jackson, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I bear to George T. James, he being of the County of Southampton and State Virginia aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration of one dollar to me in hand paid by George T. James at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said George T. James his Executors, administrators and assigns, the following negro slaves, to-wit: Ned and Seamon, also fourteen hundred dollars in Bonds and accounts, also one bay horse called Sunday, also all the hogs, that the said George T. James finds at his pen, also my best feather Bed. To have and to hold the above described property unto him the said George T. James, his Executors, Administrators and assigns, forever - And the said James Jackson for himself his Executors, administrators the said property, as above described unto him the said George T. James his Executors, administrators and assigns, against the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend them by these presents. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 19th day of October 1850.

This Indenture, made and executed this 20th day of April in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and fifty. Between Jesse L. Bailey and Dorothy H.
 his wife of the County of Transylvania of the one part, and Exum Sperry
 of the County of Southampton of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
 Jesse L. Bailey and Dorothy H. his wife, for and in consideration of the sum
 of Three hundred and fifty dollars lawful money to them in hand paid by the
 said Exum Sperry at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said Jesse L. Bailey and wife have
 granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell
 and confirm unto the said Exum Sperry his heirs and assigns forever, one certain
 tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton on the South side of the
 road leading from Smithville road to Browns road by the name of the Whig
 road and containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres more or less,
 and bounded as follows, to-wit: on the North by said Whig road, on the East
 by the Land belonging to the estate of Richard B. Kelly dec^d, on the South
 by the Land belonging to the estate of Thomas Nelson dec^d and Jeremiah Sperry
 and on the West by the Land belonging to the estate of Elias Lee dec^d
 and others, with all and singular the houses, barns, buildings, yards, gardens,
 advantages, profits, &c. whatsoever to the said tract of Land belonging or in any
 wise appertaining or with the same used and enjoyed. To have and to hold
 the said tract of Land with the premises hereinafore mentioned or intended to be
 mentioned, bargained and sold and every part thereof, with every of their rights,
 members and appurtenances unto the said Exum Sperry his heirs and assigns
