Bishop, for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred & twenty dollars, by the said Stith H. Bishop to the said Corry D. Bishop, Mary Ann White, John L. Bishop & wife & Eliza J. Bishop, in hand paid at and before the reading and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said Corry D. Bishop, Mary Ann White, John L. Bishop & wife & Eliza J. Bishop, do by these presents, grant, bargain & sell & convey unto the said Stith H. Bishop and his heirs forever all that tract or parcel of Land whereon the said Stith H. Bishop at present resides, being and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia, containing One hundred and twenty acres more or less & bounded as follows: to wit: on the north by the Land of William Sore, South and east by the Land of Geo. E. Beale, & west by the said Stith H. Bishop's Land, together with all and singular the premises hereditaments, privileges & appurtenances to the said tract of Land belonging or in any wise appertaining: To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the privileges & appurtenances aforesaid unto the said Stith H. Bishop & his heirs to the sole use and behoof of the said Stith H. Bishop & his heirs forever.
