Bishop and his heirs forever all that tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton and on which the said Sixth now resides, which is bounded as follows, to wit: South & East by the lands of John E. Beale, North by the lands of William Joyner, and west by the lands formerly belonging to the estate of Clements Rockelle; containing one hundred & twenty acres more or less; the said Sixth St. Bishop also by these presents gives, grants, bargains, sells and confirms to the said John L. Bishop and his heirs forever all that tract or parcel of land lying in said County, which the said Sixth lately purchased at a Commissioner's sale under a decree of the Court of Southampton County & which belongs to the estate of the late Clements Rockelle deceased, containing one hundred and seventy one and a half acres, more or less and bounded North by the lands of John M. Gandy, East by the lands of William Joyner, South by the lands of John E.
