This Indenture, made and entered into this 5th day of November 1850, between E. L. Lumsford and Lucy A. his wife of the Town of Chesburg of the one part and Joseph B. Barham of the County of Southampton of the other part. Witnesseth: that the said E. L. Lumsford and his wife in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & Thirty Seven $\frac{49}{100}$ Dollars of lawful money of Virginia, to them in hand paid by the said Joseph B. Barham at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Joseph B. Barham his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land, lying and being in the County of Southampton, known as apart of the Yellow house tract, formerly the property of the late Robert Nicholson and bounded by the Lines of the said Joseph B. Barham & Robert Pridley, containing two hundred & five & $\frac{9}{16}$ acres be the same more or less together with all and singular the buildings, Stables, Carrens, Orchards, Lanes, tenements, meadows, pastures, feedings, commons, woods, underwoods, ways, waters, watercourses, fishings, privileges, profits, easements, commodities, advantages, emoluments, hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of Land belonging or appertaining with the same or any part thereof. To Have and To Hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the tenements, hereditaments and all and singular other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof, with every of their rights, members and appurtenances
