

County of Southampton dec by its decree bearing date the 8th of November 1849, in a certain suit pending between Thomas C. Ripley and others against William C. Sebrell administrator of Daniel St. Brongore dec^d and others defendants direct that unless James T. Brongore and William T. Brongore infant children of Daniel St. Brongore dec^d should pay to certain persons therein named certain sums of money therein named due them from their father Daniel St. Brongore before the 1st of April next ensuing, then and in that event the said Gentry was after having given twenty days notice of the time and place of sale to sell to the highest bidder at the Court house of Southampton County in some Court day the Lands in the proceeds mentioned whereof D. St. Brongore dec^d seized. And whereas the said John M. Gentry did after having given the proper notice proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder at the time and place named, the said lands, one lot whereof John L. Bishop became the purchaser viz: a house and lot lying at the west end of Jerusalem.

Now therefore This Indenture witnesseth that the said John M. Gentry for and in consideration of the sum of sixteen hundred and forty dollars to him in hand paid, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged or otherwise secured to be paid) by the said John L. Bishop, does give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said John L. Bishop, a certain lot or tract of land lying on the west of Jerusalem containing by estimation two acres or the same more or less, and bounded as follows: on the north by the lands belonging to the estate of W. M. Sebrell dec^d on the east by the road leading from Jerusalem to Pittsburg, on the South by the lot of Spenky L. Williams, and the public road and on the west by the Nottingham river and the lands belonging to the estate of W. M. Sebrell dec^d. To have and to hold the said Lot & parcel of land unto him the said John L. Bishop and his heirs forever.

And the said John M. Gentry as Special Commissioner as aforesaid does hereby covenant and agree with the said John L. Bishop forever to warrant and defend such title as is vested in him by the said decree, unto him the said John L. Bishop and his heirs and none other, as witness his hand seal the day and year above written.

This deed, made the 22^d day of July in the year 1850, between John L. Bishop of the one part and Lottison R. Edwards of the other part, witnesseth that the said John L. Bishop, doth grant unto the said Lottison R. Edwards the following property, to wit: a lot or piece of land lying adjacent to the town of Jerusalem in the County of Southampton containing two acres more or less, being the same lot or piece of land, lately purchased by the said Bishop at a sale by John M. Gentry Commissioner acting under a decree of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Southampton in the suit of Ripley against Brongore's ad^r & others. On trust to indemnify William C. Sebrell as security for the said John L. Bishop in a certain bond executed to John M. Gentry for the sum of one thousand five hundred & thirty two dollars & 7/100 and due the 20th day of May 1857.
